Tongues + Interpretation = Prophecy

“Greater is one who prophesies than one who speaks in tongues, unless he interprets, so that the church may receive edifying.”
1 Corinthians 14:5 (NASB)

“Two or three prophets should speak and the others should weigh carefully what is said. And if a revelation comes to someone who is sitting down, the first speaker should stop.”
1 Corinthians 14:29-30

God gives revelation through: • A Dream. • A Vision.
• An Impression. • A Scripture. • A Word(s) in your mind.

Four Purposes of Prophecy:

1. Comfort.

“But one who prophesies strengthens others, encourages them, and comforts them.” 1 Corinthians 14:3 (NLT)

2. Courage.

“Then Haggai, the Lord’s messenger, gave this message of the Lord to the people, ‘I am with you,’ declares the Lord.”
Haggai 1:13

3. Convinced.

“But if everyone is prophesying, and an unbeliever or one without the gift enters your meeting, he will be convicted by all that he hears and will be called to account, for the intimate secrets of his heart will be brought to light. He will be mystified and fall facedown in worship and say, ‘God is truly among you!’”
1 Corinthians 14:24-25 (TPT)

4. Counsel.

“Finding the disciples there, we stayed with them seven days. Through the Spirit they urged Paul not to go on to Jerusalem. But when our time was up, we left and continued on our way.”
Acts 21:4-5
